

General Permit.

Received of the State of South Carolina through the South Carolina State Forestry Commission, One and no/100 (\$1.00) Dollars in consideration of which I hereby grant unto said Commission, its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and authority to construct, operate and maintain its lines of telephone, including the necessary poles, wires, and fixtures upon, over and across the property which I own, or in which I have an interest, in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina, and upon and along the reads or highways adjoining said property; said sum is received in full payment for said right, and also for the right to permit the attachment of the wires of any other company, or person to said poles and fixtures, and the right to trim and cut trees along said lines so as to clear and keep the wires cleared at least 20 feet, and the right to cut all dead or dying trees that in falling would reach the wire, and the further right to erect and set the necessary guy and brace poles and anchors, and to attach thereto and to trees the nacessary guy wires; said sum being received in full payment therefor. Said right-of way is described as follows: Beginning 200 yeards South of Davil Fork Road on Righty-61-way of Scuthern Bell T. & T. Co. run West parallel with road to small stream thence down stream to Esaverdam Creek thence across creek on same line to land of B. F. Ward, a distance of approximately three-fourths mile
