all that piece or parcel of land in Greenville

Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

on Branch waters of Saluda River, and having the following courses and distances, according to survey and plat of W. J. Riddle, Nov 2nd, 1933.

Beginning at an iron pin, S. 26° Seaborn corner, running thence with his line S. 45° E. 5.58 to stone; thence N. 69° E. 24.85 to stone; thence N. 34 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 1.70 to sweet gum stump; thence N. 62 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 25.00; thence N. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 7.00 to poplar; thence S. 62 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 1.18 to iron pin, beginning corner, bounded by J. B. Boothman, Major Coburn, Columbus Bowley, and G. W. Seaborn, and containing 34 acres more or less.
