in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and
release, unto the said E. L. Nash, his heirs and assigns.

All that certain piece, parcel and lot of land
situate, lying and being in Chick Spring Township,
County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, on the
south side of the road leading from Pelham Mill
to the Town of Green, and being a portion of the
Morgan Ross tract of land and having the following
metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a stake in the Pelham Road
and runs thence N. 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 235 feet to a bend in
said road at the intersection of the Mostella Road;
thence N. 33 E. 240 feet to a spike in the Pelham Road;
thence S. 58 E. 330 feet to an iron spike in the field;
thence S. 30 W. 487 feet to a spike on Woods line;
thence N. 56 W. 21. 318 feet to the beginning, and
containing 3. 5-8ths acres more or less.
