J. P. Talley & H. Earle Talley, all my right title and interest in Two Tracts of land

(a) My one-third undivided interest in and to all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Saluda Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on North Saluda River, and having the following metes and bounds, according to plat made by W. A. Hester, Surveyor, June 22nd, 1933.

Beginning at a stake on the River and running thence N. 26° 28' 11.00 chs. to an iron rim; thence N. 46° 12' 23.80 to a small tree n. w. thence N. 62° 34' W. 11.50 to a stone on Maggie Gilbreath's line; thence with her line S. 27° E. 29.40 to a stone on; thence S. 21° E. 10.30 to a stake on the Saluda River; thence down the meanders of, said River 10.00 to the beginning corner, and containing 37 1/2 acres, more or less.
