WHEREAS, L. C. Luttrell of Atlanta, Ga., and S. C. Matthews,
and C. E. Luttrell of Greenville, S. C.,

did on the 17th day of October, 1934, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is C. E. Luttrell & Co.,

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.,

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to engage in, carry on, and operate a general junk and scrap iron business consisting of buying, selling, trading, importing, exporting, and otherwise dealing, either wholesale or retail in all forms of iron and steel products, junk, scrap, and waste material, including paper, hides, cotton waste, cloth, especially remnant cloth, yarns and other cotton and mill products, cordage, metals, new and old iron and steel, machinery and parts, new and used pipe and relay rails, second-hand automobiles, non-ferrous metals, wrought iron, casting, foundry scrap, and all other such products of every class, nature and description usually deal in by a general junk and scrap iron business, and to do any and all other things necessary and incidental to the operation of aforesaid business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five thousand (\$5,000.00)

payable in cash and property at the call of the directors. Dollars,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is fifty (50)
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 15th day of October 1934, 1934, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
