C., on waters of Elishe Thompson's Beaver dam Creek, and on both sides of the Greer-Gowansville surface treated road, and now in the possession of W. F. Bomar, bounded Northwest by lands of R. H. Howell; Northeast by lands of W. F. Bomer; East by lands of T. Mostella and of W. F. Bomar, Southeast by lands of Mary Bright; South by lands of J. H.
