the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said
W. T. Jones,

"All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Fairview Township, Greenville County and State of South Carolina, containing 30 acres, more or less, bounded by lands of G. T. L. Hughes, Martha Garrett, Jessie Goldsmith, J. B. Jones, and others, and being the same tract of land conveyed to R. M. Spooner February 26, 1931, by deed of C. B. Watson and known as the old Stone Mill Place. (Also Mill right and equipment).
