I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:  
WHEREAS, Marie M. Trammell

came about the 14th day of May in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty five exhibited her complaint in the Court of Common Pleas for the County aforesaid, against C. F. Putman and George E. Trammell

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 16th day of July 1935 and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Marie M. Trammell

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, known and designated as Lot No. 24, in Tract No. 1 of a subdivision known as Overbrook Land Company, according to plat of same made by R. E. Dalton, Eng. June, 1924, reference being craved thereto for a more complete description, and being the same property conveyed to C. F. Putman, by R.J. Rowley."
