in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Planters Savings Bank, a Corporation, an undivided one-half interest in that certain tract of land on the Middle Tyger River, described as follows:

Beginning at a stone, thence N. 75 E. 39-50 chains to a stone; thence N. 76 E. 14 chains to a stone on original line; thence S. 34 1/2 E. 16.80 chains to a red oak; thence S. 53 1/2 W. 5-30 to a stone; thence S. 8 W. 10.33 chains to a stone; thence S. 75 W. 45.44 chains to a stake in the road; thence N. 65 W. 9.02 chains to a stone on side of Rutherford Road; thence N. 16 W. 21.72 chains to the beginning corner; containing one hundred and fifty (150) acres, more or less, being the same conveyed by G. W. Holtzclaw to N. D. Franks and W. F. Holtzclaw by deed recorded in Book GGG, page 18, less, however, eighty-four and one-half (84 1/2) acres, more or less, conveyed by W. F. Holtzclaw and N. D. Franks to W. T. Forrester, Jr., by deed dated August 17, 1909, recorded May 2, 1910, in Vol. 8, page 230.

Also, an undivided one-half interest in a certain tract of land containing fifteen (15) acres, more or less, situated on the south side of Beaverdam creek, and bounded by lands now or formerly owned by J. J. Bruce and the William Mitchell estate and being the same land conveyed to N. D. Franks and W. F. Holtzclaw by W. W. Forest by deed dated June 4, 1902, and recorded in February 19, 1903, in Book JJJ, page 370.

Also all that certain tract of land described as follows; and lying on the Rutherford Road and bounded by land now or formerly owned by N. D. Franks and W. F. Holtzclaw and J. T. Hawkins in Highland Township, and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the Rutherford Road on a stake, thence East to a hickory thence north to a stone; thence west to a white oak on said road; thence up said road to the beginning corner, containing four acres, more or less, and being the same property conveyed to T. F. Dill, A. J. Stokes and P. C. Barnatt, as trustees of Tiger School 13-1, and being the same property conveyed to the Peoples State Bank of South Carolina by Greer Bank & Trust Company by deed dated July 25, 1931 and recorded in Book 132, at page 213, office of Clerk of Court for Greenville County.

One half interest herein above having been already the property of Planters Savings Bank, and the intention of the grantors is to convey by these presents the remaining one-half interest.
