WHEREAS, D. C. Woods and R. C. Collins, both of
Greenville, S. C.

did on the 1st day of April, 1933, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Woods and Collins, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is buy, sell and deal in automobiles and trucks, or in any personal property or merchandise, including auto parts and accessories, to operate garages, and automobile repair shops : to conduct a general finance business, engage in financing sales or purchases of autos or equipment, and to do everytaining generally which is not contrary to the laws of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten thousand (\$10,000.00)

payable upon call of the directors, at least one half of the said amount being payable immediately. Dollars,

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) of the par value of one hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 31st day of March, 1933 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:
D. C. Woods, R. C. Collins, H. A. Moore, R. H. Hammond,
and M. Gwinn.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President D. C. Woods
as Vice-President, R. C. Collins, ; as Secretary, M. Gwinn
as Treasurer, D. C. Woods.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont,
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
