WHL REAS, David B. Traylor, M. G. Traylor, J. E. Traylor, M. E. Traylor, David G. Traylor, Wm. Byrd Traylor, and E. B. Traylor, all of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 29th day of April, 1937, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Traylor Real Estate Company.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to invest in, hold, buy, sell and otherwise deal in notes, bonds, mortgages, stock and other securities; to borrow and lend money; to buy, sell, own, hold, lease, sub-lease real estate and generally engage in the real estate business; to act as agent and broker in the management and renting and in the sale and transfer of real estate; to engage in a general insurance business; to act as agent and broker in soliciting and writing all forms of insurance, together with full right, privilege and power to do any and all acts and things which may be necessary in anywise incident to the exercise and use of the rights, privileges and powers hereinabove set forth, and generally exercise all the right, privileges and powers conferred by law on business corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars,

payable in money or property at the call of the directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 30th day of April, 1937 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

David B. Traylor, M. G. Traylor, J. E. Traylor, M. E. Traylor, David G. Traylor, Wm. Byrd Traylor and E. B. Traylor

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President D. B. Traylor as Vice-President, M. G. Traylor; as Secretary, J. E. Traylor as Treasurer, D. B. Traylor, as Assistant Secretary, M. G. Traylor

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

The Observer a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
