WHEREAS, Joseph C. Cambria, 2131 East Clinch St., Baltimore, Md., Sidney M. Jacobs, 415 Equitable Building, Baltimore, Md., Jeanette Parkinson, 710 Springfield Ave., Baltimore, Md., did on the 12th day of May, 1938, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Baseball and Amusement Company, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is (A) To operate and maintain a team of professional baseball players in Greenville or elsewhere, and to purchase, acquire, lease, own, sell and manage baseball grounds, grandstands, club houses, theatres and other places of amusement, and to maintain, purchase or rent, lease, sell or dispose of buildings for any of the purposes aforesaid, and generally carry on the business of furnishing amusement to the public. (B) To hold, buy, sell, lease, mortgage, convey and deal in baseball grounds and other amusement places or club houses and buildings for same. (C) To carry on any business in connection with the objects and purposes aforesaid. (D) To acquire, purchase and to hold for investment or otherwise, or use or sell stocks, bonds, and to exercise voting powers thereon, to borrow money, to issue notes and bonds, deeds, and to exercise in regard to all notes, bonds, mortgages, deeds of trust, and other contracts all rights and privileges which natural persons may exercise.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars.

payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) of the par value of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 11th day of May, 1938, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

Joseph C. Cambria, Sidney M. Jacobs, and Jeanette Parkinson

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Joseph C. Cambria; as Vice-President, Sidney M. Jacobs; as Secretary, Jeanette Parkinson; as Treasurer, Jeanette Parkinson

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, The Greenville News

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
