I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, *Southland Lumber Company and Trust Company, a Corporation, et al.*

on or about the 29th day of May, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty-four, March 29, 1935, exhibited their complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against J. C. Hartley, Et Al.

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 14th day of April, 1936, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Diversity Five Hundred (\$550.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said Sarah A. McNamee and Elizabeth McNamee Lide,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Sarah A. McNamee and Elizabeth McNamee Lide,

"All those certain lots, pieces or parcels of land situate lying and being in the City and County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, in the Neighborhood of the City of Greenville, known and designated as Lot No. 25 on plat of record of Mrs. Hammie S. Morris deceased, made by Will D. Nancy, dated October 22, 1913 and recorded in the office of the P.W.C. for said County and State in "Plat Book #1" at Page 261, fronting 60 feet on the south side of Morris Street and running back 114 feet or more to an ally, being the same lot of land conveyed to W.
