Sevell, et al.demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 17th day of November, 1937, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree.

for sale by public outcry on the 6th day of December in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, did then openly and publicly, according to the custom of auctions, sell and dispose of the same unto Hattie Schumate.for the sum of Five hundred and twenty-one dollars (\$500.00)

being at that price the highest bidder therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Five hundred and twenty-one dollars (\$500.00), to me paid by the said Hattie Schumate,the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, Bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Hattie Schumate

all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greenville, having at frontage on Trichols Street of 50 feet more or less, and running back a depth of 56 feet approximately parallel with Green Avenue.

This is all of the lot which was conveyed to Thomas Lomax by E. Inman, Master, by his deed bearing date March 5, 1923, recorded in Deed Book 94, Page 72, R. M. C. Office of the Register of Deeds, Greenville County, except that part of the lot having a frontage on Green Avenue of 50 feet more or less, and running back a depth of 81 feet, this lot on Green Avenue excepted herefrom is now owned by J. L. Mayes.
