on or about the 20<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty seven exhibited Lawsuit complaint in the Court of Greenville, for the County aforesaid, against E. L. Hascall, et al

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1937, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate

for sale by public outcry on the 2nd day of January in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirty eight did then openly and publicly, according to the custom of auctions, sell and dispose of the same unto J. L. Brashears

for the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars (\$200.00) Dollars, being at that price the highest bidder therefor.

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars (\$200.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said J. L. Brashears,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. L. Brashears

"all that piece, parcel or lot of land in the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville, being a part of a tract known as the "Hillhouse Tract", a plat of the same being recorded in the R. M. C. Office for said County in Plat Book "A", at page 335, this lot herein described containing one and one-half acre, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds:

"Beginning at a corner on the south side of New Riverside Road, at the corner of Macbeth Street, and running thence along said New Riverside Road N. 42-30 W. 217 feet, 8 inches to a stake, thence S. 47-30 E. 300 feet to a stake in the rear, thence S. 42-30 E. 217 feet 8 inches to a stake on said Macbeth Street, thence along Macbeth Street N. 47-30 E. 300 feet to the beginning corner, and being numbered 102 on the said plat.

This is the same lot conveyed to St. L. Hascall, Sr., by St. J. Shackstow, Annie Shackstow, and Emmie Shackstow, as sole heirs at law of St. J. Shackstow deceased, by deed dated May 12, 1911, see R. M. C. Office, Vol. 19, page 276, and a subsequent deed by said parties to correct errors in description of said lot in said first deed."
