in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release, unto the said Amanda Ella Southern and her heirs and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being near Ansel School, in Oneal Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing thirty-one (31) acres, and known as Tract No. 3 of the W. G. Southern Estate according to survey and plat thereof by H. S. Brockman, Surveyor, dated April 6, 1936, and having the following courses and distances, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin, northwestern corner of tract, and running thence N. 89.54 E. 1057 feet to iron pin on community road; thence along said road S. 30.30 E. 455 feet to iron pin; thence S. 58 E. 1133 feet to stone; thence S. 77.49 W. 888.4 feet to stone; thence N. 77 W. 330 feet to iron pin on old road; thence N. 86.25 W. 375 feet to iron pin in gully; thence N. 20.20 W. 732 feet to iron pin; thence N. 87.40 W. 277 feet to iron pin; thence N. 20.23 W. 412 feet to the beginning corner.
