in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release, unto the said F. E. Holland, his heirs and assigns:

All my right, title and interest in and to (the same being an undivided one sixth) all that certain tract of land in Dunklin Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, having the following metes and bounds according to a plat made by J. R. Williams, Surveyor in January 1900.

Beginning at a stone 3x on line of William Mason and running thence N. 23 1/2 E. 2.10 chains to stone 3x on; thence N. 25 1/2 S. 23.14 chains to stone 3x on; thence N. 35 1/2 S. 14.10 chains to stone 3x on; thence N. 5 1/2 S. 4.63 chains to stone 3x on on line of land now or formerly owned by A. Ramsey; thence N. 67 1/2 S. 16 chains to stake on bank of Peedy River; thence along the meanders of said River as a line in a southerly direction to an Ash 3x on in old bed of River, corner of land now or formerly owned by William Mason; thence with the line of said land S. 76 W. 34.50 chains to the beginning corner, containing 143.50 acres, more or less.
