All that parcel, tract or lot of land, lying on south side of Brushy Creek and on the west side of Hudson Road, crossed by Chick Springs-Butler Township, line, county and state aforesaid, adjoining lands of Arthur Hudson on the west, Robert Smith Estate on the north-west and north, widow Hunt on the east, known as the Young Diver Place, and having the following metes and bounds:-

Beginning on a maple on the south bank of Brushy Creek about 100 feet west of Ross bridge, thence S. 32 E. ^{05.62} 1.57 chains to stone on west side of Hudson Road at pasture fence, thence S. 15 3/4 W. 8.29 chains to a point in Hudson Road, thence S. 8 3/4 W. 7.41 chains to point in Hudson Road, thence S. 39 W. 4.86 chains to a point in Hudson Road, thence S. 28 3/4 W. 12.84 chains to a point in Hudson Road, thence S. 50 1/4 W. 3.70 chains to iron pin on east bank of Hudson Road, thence S. 56 W. 4.87 chains to iron pin on south bank of Hudson Road in edge of woods, thence with Arthur Hudson line, N. 3/4 W. to iron pin at Arthur Hudson pasture fence, thence N. 29 E. 23.76 chains to stone near old run of Brushy Creek, thence N. 50 1/4 W. .37 of a chain to maple stump standing in water of old run of Brushy Creek, thence with old run of Brushy Creek as the line (about 11.05) to the beginning corner, and containing twenty four and ninety-hundredths (24.90) acres, more or less, according to survey made by J. Earle Freeman, Feb. 16, 1939.
