WHEREAS, J. McD. Law and R. O. Tuten, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 25th day of September, 1939, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Law-Tuten Realty and Investment Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is 14 East Broad Street, Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to transact a general real estate agency and brokerage business; to own, improve, manage, sell, mortgage, rent and lease, any and all forms of real estate, to erect and construct houses for rental or sale; to conduct general insurance agency, and insurance brokerage business, for the insurance of human beings and property against any and all forms of losses; to transact a general securities agency and investment business; to own, buy and sell all forms of stocks, bonds, mortgages, and securities and to conduct a general investment agency.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars,
payable cash and property.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Eighty (80) Dollars.
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 21st day of September, 1939 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:
J. McD. Law and R. O. Tuten.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President J. McD. Law
as Vice-President, X; as Secretary, R. O. Tuten
as Treasurer, R. O. Tuten.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News
Greenville
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
