All those certain tracts of land located in Glassy Mountain Township, County and State aforesaid, located some fourteen to seventeen miles north of Tigerville right at the edge of the foot of Glassy Mountain, bounded by lands of Robinson, Pruitts, Pittmans and others:

Tract # 1 contains two hundred acres, more or less, and is the same tract of land conveyed to the said E. B. Johnson by J. H. Parnell by deed dated August 17, 1907 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Volume VVV at Page 435- to which deed reference is craved for further description.

Tract # 2 contains thirty acres, more or less, and lies within a mile of the above described tract of land on head waters of Tiger River and being the same tract of land conveyed to the said E. B.
