WHEREAS, Lyndon W. Joyce and Stephen Nettles,
of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 10th day of May, 1940, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville National Corporation

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is manufacture and process goods from cotton, rayon, rubber and other materials, and to deal in all types of textile products, machinery and supplies.

And One thousand (1,000) Shares of no par value,
payable in property and in cash, as called for by the Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred and forty (140)
Preferred Stock
of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

And One Thousand (1,000) Shares of Common Stock of no par value.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 3rd day of May, 1940, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

Cress J. Fay, Wm. I. Blanton and Lyndon W. Joyce.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President & Treasurer, Lyndon W. Joyce

as Vice-President, Mrs. Cress J. Fay; as Secretary, Wm. I. Blanton.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in.....

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
