WHEREAS, Geo. M. Evans, R. 5, Camp Road, Greenville, S. C.
and Madgaline Evans, R. 5, Camp Road, Greenville, S. C.

did on the 28th day of June, 1940, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Motor Freight Terminal Incorporated.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to operate a pick up and delivery motor freight terminal for handling interstate freight traffic; to do a general hauling, trucking and transfer business, within the State of South Carolina; to operate and maintain one or more storage and distributing warehouses; to own, sell and mortgage real estate, together with all rights and privileges conferred by law on business corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars,

payable in cash or property as called for by the Board of Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is fifty (50) Dollars.
of the par value of one hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 25th day of June, 1940, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

Geo. M. Evans, Madgaline Evans, Charles V. Ledwell, and John I. Wood.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Geo. M. Evans

as Vice-President, Madgaline C. Evans; as Secretary, Madgaline C. Evans

as Treasurer, Geo. M. Evans.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
