did on the 29th day of January, 1940, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is TEXTILE BROADCASTING COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to apply for radio broadcasting station construction permits and licenses from the Federal Communication Commission. To establish, install, maintain, operate and lease and own all kinds of receiving and sending radio and wireless telegraph and telephone stations in the City of Greenville, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and elsewhere as may be decided upon by the directors of the corporation, with the permission of the Federal Communication Commission. The corporation further proposes the doing of any and everything necessary and proper in the conduct of a general radio broadcasting station, and such as are necessary and proper in the advancement of the best interests of said corporation and its stockholders.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President R. A. Jolley

as Vice-President, Wayne M. Nelson; as Secretary, Wayne M. Nelson

as Treasurer, R. A. Jolley

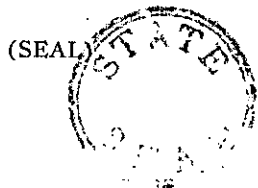
NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
