GENERAL PERMIT

\$1.00 Received of the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company, One & 00/100 Dollars in consideration of which I hereby grant unto said Company, its associated and allied companies, their respective successors and assigns, the right, privilege and authority to construct, operate, and maintain its lines of Telephone and Telegraph, and for the general transmission of intelligence, consisting of such poles, wires, cables, conduits, guys, anchors and other fixtures and appurtenances as the grantee may from time to time require, upon, across, over and/or under the property which I own or in which I have any interest in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina and upon, along and/or under the roads, streets or highways adjoining the said property, and the right to permit the attachment of and/or carry in conduit wires and cables of any other company or person, and with the further right to trim and to keep trimmed all trees and undergrowth within 3 feet of said line, and in addition thereto, the grantee shall have the right to cut down, from time to time, all dead, weak, leaning or dangerous trees that are tall enough to reach the wires in falling; said sum being received in full payment for the rights herein granted.

The above mentioned line to be constructed just off edge of the Parker road.

The above mentioned line to be constructed just off edge of the Cedar Lane road, thence across said property from Cedar Lane road to Parker road.
