All that piece, parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, about four and one-half miles from Greenville Court House, and containing five acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:- Beginning at a point on the White Horse Road, and running thence S. 74 W. 14.20 to a stone 3 x n m; thence S. 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 3.70 to stone 3 x n m. near Post Oak; thence N. 74 E. 14.20 to a stone 3 x n m; on White Horse Road; thence along said White Horse Road as a line, N. 5- $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 3.70 to the beginning corner, and being a part of the tract of land conveyed to me by J. L. Campbell, by deed dated December 2, 1910, and conveyed to J. L. Campbell, by deed of J. W. Gray, Master for Greenville County, South Carolina, dated December 8, 1908, and recorded in R. M. C.
