 said Tillman Henderson, his heirs and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land containing thirty four and one third (34-1/3) acres, more or less, situate lying and being in Greenville County, South Carolina, on
 the east branch of Gilder's Creek, waters of Enoree River, having the following courses and
 distances, to-wit: Beginning at a stone #X01, and running thence south 11 degrees west 3.72 chains
 to hickory; thence south 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west 6.73 chains to hickory; thence south 10-3/4 degrees west
 6.43 chains to stone; thence south 78 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east 2.40 chains to stone on the bank of Gilder's
 Creek; thence up the meanders of said creek to stone on said creek; thence north 78 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west
 21.10 chains to stone, the beginning corner.
