 time to time require, upon, across, over and-or under the property which I own or in which I
 have any interest in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina
 and upon, along and-or under the roads, streets, or highways adjoining the said property, and the right to permit the attachment of and-or carry in conduit wires
 and cables of any other company or person, and with the further right to trim and cut down and to keep trimmed and cut down all trees and undergrowth within
 10 feet of said line, and in addition thereto, the grantee shall have the right to cut down, from time to time, all dead, weak,
 leaning or dangerous trees that are tall enough to reach the wires in falling; said sum being received in full payment for the rights herein granted.
