WHEREAS, H. R. Stephenson, R. J. Stephenson, Jr.,  
and R. D. Sellers,

did on the 1st day of May, 1943, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
- SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is HARBO, INC.
- THIRD: That the principal place of business is TAYLORS, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is a general brokerage, investment, manufacturing and mercantile business, to buy, sell, exchange, assign, transfer and mortgage real estate, stocks, bonds, securities and other personal property, to execute all necessary instruments to carry out such purposes and generally to have and exercise all such powers as are conferred by law upon business corporations.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars,  
payable upon the call of the Directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred and fifty (250) Dollars,  
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 6th day of September, 1933, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:  
H. R. Stephenson, R. J. Stephenson, Jr.,  
and R. D. Sellers.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President H. R. Stephenson  
as Vice-President R. J. Stephenson, Jr.; as Secretary, R. D. Sellers  
as Treasurer, R. D. Sellers.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in  
The Observer  
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
