to it in hand duly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the grantee (S.) hereinafter named (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto Harry L. Trammell and Inez Brown Trammell, their Heirs and Assigns, forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on the Northeast side of Forest Circle, near the City of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, known as Lot No. 13 on Map No. 1 of Victor-Monaghan Company property made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, December 1941, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book M, at page 39, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the Northeast side of Forest Circle at joint front corner of Lots No. 12 and 13, and running thence with the line of Lot No. 12, N. 38-30 E. 200 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 51-30 W. 140 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line of Lot No. 14, S. 27-11 W. 204 feet to an iron pin on the Northeast side of Forest Circle; thence with the North-east side of Forest Circle S. 51-30 E. 100 feet to the beginning corner.

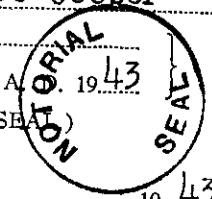
