

TITLE TO REAL ESTATE

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, John A. Theodore and Fannye V. Theodore, of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 1st day of December, 1944, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Liquor Distributors, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is the wholesale distribution of liquor and to do any and all things incident to the proper management and maintenance of such business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00)

payable 20% in cash and the balance at the call of the directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is five hundred (500) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 22nd day of November, 1944, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: John A. Theodore and Fannye V. Theodore

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President John A. Theodore as Vice-President; as Secretary, Fannye V. Theodore as Treasurer, John A. Theodore

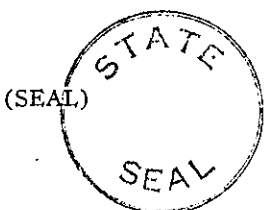
NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

The Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
