and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the public road leading from Augusta Road to Antioch Church on line of property known as the Moseley property and running thence along the center of said road N 67.50 E 932 feet to a point where the road leading from Augusta Road to Reedy Fork Church crosses the first mentioned road; thence along the road toward Reedy Fork Church S 38.45 E 475 feet to a bend; thence S 42 E 800 feet to a bend, thence S 30.10 E 380 feet to a bend; thence S 28.30 E 700 feet to a bend; thence S 43 E 226.7 feet to a point in said road on line of W. A. Tripp property; thence along that line S 68.48 W 1205 feet to a stone on line of J. A. Blakely property; thence along that line N 18.45 W 643.5 feet to an iron pin on the North bank of a road; thence still along the line of the Blakely property N 19 W 539 feet to an iron pin, corner of Russell Ashmore property; thence along that line N 19.15 W 877 feet to an iron pin; thence N 69.45 W 619.5 feet to the beginning corner, containing 50.91 acres, more or less.
