Whereas, We all agree to the following division.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That We, Cora P. Pitman, Mammie P. Turner, Mathais Pitman, Mildred P. Pruitte, Lilda P. Harrison

in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of (\$1000.00) One Thousand Dollars (Value of our undivided interest in said land) DOLLARS

to us in hand paid, at and before the sealing of these presents by George W. Pitman, Thurman Pitman, Ollie P. Hughes, Ernest Pitman

in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said George W. Pitman, Therman Pitman, Ollie P. Hughes, Ernest Pitman and their heirs and assigns, all of our undivided interest in said land.

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Glassy Mt. Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, Having the following metes and bounds, and courses and distances. Beginning at a poplar and running N. 40 1/2 W. 20.00 to a large rock; thence S. 61 1/2 W. 10.00 ch. to a large stone in the branch, thence down the meanders of said branch 10.10 to a small poplar or stone, thence S. 31 1/2 W. 9.77 to a stone, thence S. 15 1/2 E. .89 to a stone, thence S. 48 W. 6.68 to a stone, thence S. 13 E. 18.05 to a small pine, thence N. 72 1/2 E. 7.66 to sweet Gum old and down, thence N. 81 E. 2.11 to a stone, thence N. 75 E. 4.16 to a stone, thence N. 9 1/2 W. 9.00 to a Hickory dead on the branch, thence up the branch with the meanders to the beginning corner. Containing seventy four and 1/2 acres, more or less.

Also all that other piece, parcel and tract of land situate in County and State aforesaid one the head waters of Middle Tyger River containing forty five acres, more or less Beginning on a Chestnut and running thence E. 27.50 to a poplar thence S. 20 W. 25. to a chestnut thence S. 57 E. to a poplar thence to the beginning corner.
