Beginning at a stone 3x on line of William Mahon and running thence N. 23 1/2 E. 6.10 chains to stone 3xom; thence N. 25 1/2 E. 22.14 chains to stone 3xom; thence N. 55 1/2 E. 14.10 chains to stone 3xom; thence N. 5 1/2 E. 4.63 chains to stone 3xom on line of land now or formerly owned by A. Ramsey; thence N. 87 3/4 E. 16 chains to stake on bank of Reedy River; thence along the meanders of said river as a line in a Southerly direction to an Ash 3xom in old run of river, corner of land now or formerly owned by William Mahon; thence with the line of said land S. 78 W. 54.50 chains to the beginning corner, containing 143.58 acres, more or less.
