WHEREAS, J. H. Holcombe and C. L. Davenport,
both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 3rd day of January, 1947, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is GREENVILLE-PICKENS SPEEDWAY, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is engage in and carry on the business of the operation of a speedway or race track or any other amusement business, buy, sell, own and lease real estate and personal property, buy and sell and own stocks, bonds and other securities, and to do each and every thing necessary and suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or which at any time shall appear conducive to or expedient for the protection or benefit of this corporation.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars, payable

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred fifty (150) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

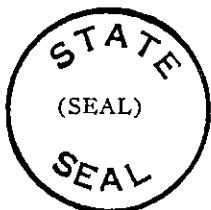
SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 18th day of December, 1946, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: J. H. Holcombe, C. L. Davenport and R. C. Willimon

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President J. H. Holcombe as Vice-President, R. C. Willimon; as Secretary, G. L. Davenport as Treasurer, C. L. Davenport

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
