A G R E E M E N T

This agreement made and concluded in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, this 20th day of March, 1947, by and between Ralph B. Moss, Ralph C. McBride and Samuel B. Evans, Jr., all of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, witnesseth as follows:

1. That the said parties will become, and by these presents do agree to be, partners together under the name or firm of Business Equipment Company, for the purpose of buying and selling all sorts of goods, wares and merchandise to the said business belonging and all other business incidental thereto. The business to be carried on at 28 College Street, in the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, or at such building as the parties hereto may hereafter determine. The partnership to commence on the 20th day of March, 1947 and to continue until dissolved as hereinafter provided.

2. To that end and purpose the said Ralph C. McBride and Samuel B. Evans, Jr., have each contributed in cash, the sum of FIFTEEN HUNDRED (\$1,500.00) Dollars, and the said Ralph B. Moss has contributed a Chevrolet Coupe, the value of which is hereby agreed to be the sum of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) Dollars, and the said Ralph B. Moss agrees to contribute in cash, the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, on or before the first day of January, 1949. The capital so contributed to be used and employed by them for the support and management of the said business, to their mutual benefit and advantage.

3. It is agreed and understood, that at all times during the partnership, each party will bear, pay and discharge equally between them all rents and other expenses that may be required for the support and management of the said business. All gains, profit, and increase from or by means of the said business shall be divided between them equally; and all loss to their business shall be borne between them equally.
