County, State of South Carolina being a portion of a larger tract known as the  
Old Smith Place (a plat of which was made by Dalton & Neves in Feb-  
ruary, 1927, and was recorded in the office of the Register of  
Mesne Conveyances for Greenville County in plat book J at page 77),  
the tract herein conveyed being located on the Staunton Bridge  
Road 3 1/2 miles from Greenville city, bounded on the North by lands  
of Simmons, on the West by lands of Huff and Simmons, on the South  
by lands of Huff, and on the East by the Staunton Bridge Road, and  
having the following metes and bounds, to wit:
