

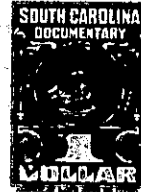

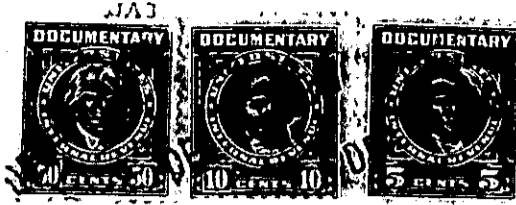

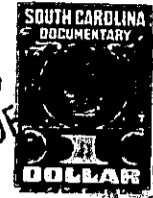

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Thousand Seventy-Four and 21/100

to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by
William M. McGinty

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said William M. McGinty, his heirs and assigns, forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on the South side of Camille Avenue, near the City of Greenville, in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being shown as the Eastern 61 feet of Lot 6 on plat of property of T. Q. Donaldson, Estate, made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, April 1935, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book H. at page 234 and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Camille Avenue at joint front corner of Lots 6 and 7 and running thence along the line of Lot 7 S. 8-45 W. 129 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 81-15 W. 61 feet to an iron pin in the rear line of Lot 6; thence through Lot 6 N. 8-45 E. 131 feet more or less to an iron pin on the South side of Camille Avenue; thence with the South side of Camille Avenue S. 79-16 E. 61 feet to the point of beginning.

This is a portion of that property conveyed to me by Harriett M. Donaldson, deed dated January 31, 1945, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 271, page 438.
