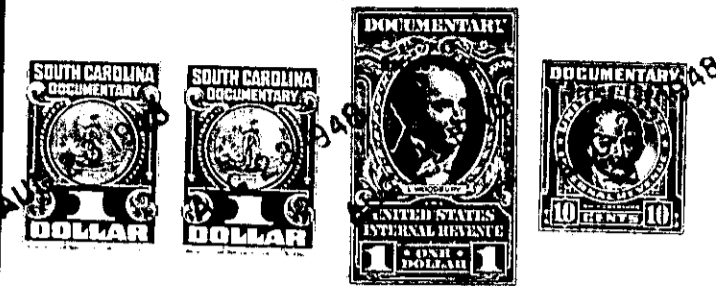

Railway in Town of Mauldin, S. C., adjoining lands of Watson Greene,
Mr. Austin, et al., and containing 2 acres according to a plat made
by W. J. Riddle in July 1948, and having according to said plat the
