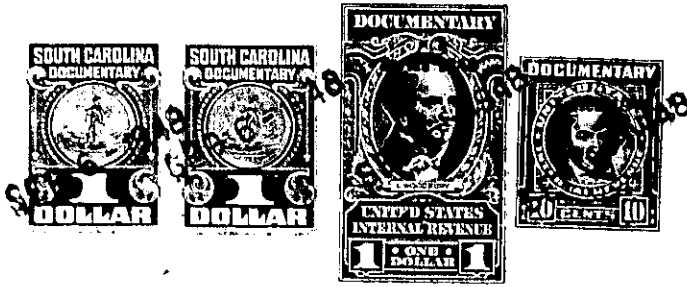

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Saluda Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina lying on the east side of a country road leading by Campbell's Mill and bounded by lands of E.O. and Nellie J. Raines on the south and east and on the north by Noe's Creek and containing Three and 4/10 (3.4) acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds: BEGINNING at a stake in creek and running thence S. 43-00 W. 700 feet to a point in road; thence S. 63-15 E. 230 feet to a stake; thence along the west bank of old road N. 45-45 E. 400 feet to a stone; thence N. 28-15 E. 150 feet to a stone; thence N. 9-30 E. 135 feet to a stake on south bank of creek; thence with creek as property line N. 56-35 W. 129 feet to the beginning corner and being all of the same lot or tract of land conveyed to us by E.O. and Nellie J.
