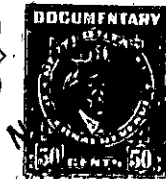

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Horace K. Hendrix his Heirs and Assigns forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Fairview Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina and containing 17.19 acres, more or less, according to a plat and survey made by E. E. Gary, Surveyor, on October 26, 1948, and having the following metes and bounds, according to said plat, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin in the edge of road that leads from the old Wasson place by C. Rodgers place, running thence N. 89-3/4 E. 4.95 to an iron pin; thence S 7-3/4 E. 9.43 to an iron pin; thence S. 1-25 W. 23.20 to an iron pin; thence S. 89 1/2 W. 4.80 to a stone; thence N. 2-3/4 W. 21.93 along Old Indian Boundary Line to a point in or near the eastern edge of public road that leads from the old Wasson place by the old C. Rodgers place; thence with said road N. 1/4 W. 9.35 to an iron pin, the point of beginning, and bounded by lands of Robert Thomason, T. E. Coker and other lands of the grantor.
