

said portion hereby conveyed being more particularly described as follows:

A. BEGINNING at a station marked B-15 and A-0 corner of the State lines of North and South Carolina and also corner of Henderson County and Transylvania County, North Carolina; thence S. 13-48 W. 4993.5' with line of J. H. Cleveland to corner marked A-62, (being the same line as boundary line shown on survey- 1918-1921 prepared by Howard Wiswall, C.E.); being corner of lands of Saluda Land & Lumber Company; thence S. 60 W. 633.1' to corner marked A-59; thence N. 80-32 W. 1549.3' to corner marked A-51; thence N. 51-10 W. 1132.2' crossing Cox's Shoal Creek to corner marked A-47; thence N. 21-27 W. 2140.3' to corner marked A-34 on hickory in low gap Little Rich Mountain on the North Carolina-South Carolina State Line; thence with the meanders of said State line in a N. E. direction to the beginning corner, containing 332.9 acres, more or less, as shown on a plat of survey made by J. E. Sirrine, Engineer, dated July 3, 1924, and recorded in Plat Book "F", Page 242, in the R. M. C. Office for County and State aforesaid.

B. BEGINNING at a station marked D-17, (which point is also marked E-0) and is located on a trail as shown on said plat, and running thence N. 56-45 E. 1177 feet to a station marked D-23; thence S. 38-12 E. 846 feet to a station marked D-26; thence N. 87-17 E. 1630 feet to a White Oak 5 feet North of a station marked A-47 & D-33, which station is the joint corner of this tract and the 332.9 acre tract hereinabove described in paragraph "A"; thence in a Northwesterly direction along the West line of the said 332.9 acre tract N. 21-27 W. 2140.3 feet to a corner on a Hickory in a low gap on Little Rich Mountain, which corner is also on the North Carolina and South Carolina boundary line; thence in a Westerly direction along the meanders of said state line, and with said line as the boundary, to a point bounded by five Chestnuts and which point is 4 feet West of a station marked D-9; thence S. 7-14 W. 1532 feet to the point of beginning, containing 91 acres, more or less, as shown on a plat of survey made by J. E. Sirrine, Engineer, dated July 3, 1924, and recorded in Plat Book "F", Page 242, in the R. M. C. Office for County and State aforesaid.

For the further consideration as hereinabove mentioned, the herein named Grantee, as Trustee of the Camp Greenville Fund, for itself and for the Trustees of the Young Men's Christian Association, by acceptance of this Deed, does hereby RELEASE and RELINQUISH unto the said Saluda Land & Lumber Company, its successors and assigns, all of the right, title and interest of the said Trustee, and/or the said Young Men's Christian Association, in and to that certain right-of-way heretofore granted to the said Trustees by the said Saluda Land & Lumber Company, by its Deed dated June 2, 1924, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for the County and State aforesaid, namely, 100 feet of land along and with the approximate line beginning at Station E-0 and running in a Northwest direction to Station E-15, a point in the Green River Road near the North Carolina-South Carolina State Line, which line of right-of-way is indicated
