the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said

H. S. Altman

"All that piece, parcel or tract of land located in Saluda Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, on the waters of North Saluda River and bounded by lands of William Turner, W. D. Southern, W. C. Pitman and others, being known as the Saw Mill Tract and containing 88 acres, more or less.

BEGINNING at a corner on William Turner's line and running thence South 6 East 22.90 chains to a Black Gum corner; thence South 59-3/4 East 24.00 chains to a stone corner; thence North 20-3/4 East 13.55 chains to a stone corner; thence South 28 1/4 East 3.68 chains to a rock pile; thence North 14 East 12.12 chains to a Spanish Oak (down); thence North 40-3/4 West 13.25 chains to a dogwood corner near road; thence North 61 1/2 West 9.37 chains to a stone corner William Turner's land; thence with Turner's line South 84.0 West 16.80 chains, more or less to the beginning corner.
