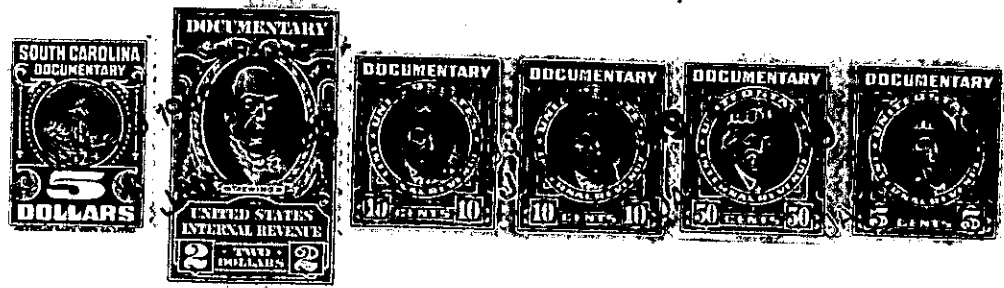

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, Betty Lois Whitaker, of Greenville County in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Twenty-Three Hundred, Fifty and No/100 Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by F. J. Lindsey and Victoria L. Lindsey (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said F. J. Lindsey and Victoria L. Lindsey, their heirs and assigns forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, School District 8-AB, being known and designated as Lot No. 5 on a plat of the property of Edwin McT. Meares and I. C. Davis made by Dalton and Neves, Engineers, April, 1943, recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book N, at page 127, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Bishop Street at the joint front corners of Lots 4 and 5, and running thence along the South side of Bishop Street, S. 66-32 E. 51 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 49-33 W. 79.4 feet to an iron pin at the joint corners of Lots 3 and 5; thence with the line of Lot 3, N. 51-0 W. 43.7 feet to an iron pin at the joint rear corners of Lots 4 and 5; thence with the line of Lot 4, N. 46-57 E. 65.2 feet to the beginning corner.

The above described lot is shown on the Township Block Book at Sheet 111, Block 3, Lot 7-A, and the grantees are to pay taxes for 1949.

The above described land is the same conveyed to me by Mrs. Tennie Harbin Whitaker, et. al on the 10th day of April 19 47, deed recorded in office Register of Mesne Conveyance for County, in Book 310 Page 270.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said F. J. Lindsey and Victoria L. Lindsey, their Heirs and Assigns forever.
