KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, Homer A. Craft, C. E. Craft, Catherine C. Hawkins and Evelyn C. Roberson, of the County of Greenville, S. C., W. C. Craft of the County of Anderson, S. C., W. L. Craft of the State of Nebraska, and Janette C. White of the State of Ohio, in consideration of the sum of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, love and affection, to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Bessie Craft (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Bessie Craft, her heirs and assigns, all of our rights, title and interest to and in all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Chick Springs Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on Enorse River, containing Fifty One (51) acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a corner in the said Enorse River, 3xom, and running thence N. 22 W. 14.25 to a walnut stump, 3xom, now stone, 3xom; N. 59 W. 27.75 to stone, 3xom, in Rutherford Road; thence with said Road to the River; thence down the meanders of said Enorse River to the beginning corner.
