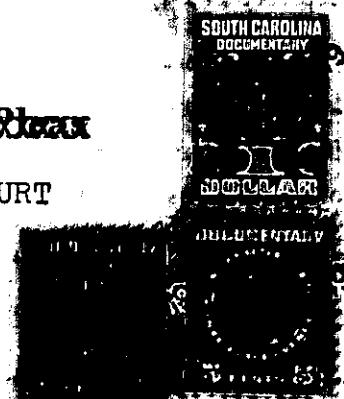

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to  
be heard on the 11th day of March, 1949,  
and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged  
and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN,  
Master in and for the County aforesaid, to Frank Crumpton and Viola Crumpton  
for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear;

of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, and upon receipt of \$350.00

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release  
unto the said Frank Crumpton and Viola Crumpton

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Town-  
ship, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and better known and  
designated as Lot No. 15 in Section B of the property of Alice M. and  
W. H. Willis, on a plat made by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, 1939, and  
recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in  
Plat Book J, at Page 151, to which said plat and the record thereof is  
hereby made for a more definite and complete description of said lot.

This property is sold subject to all restrictions now recorded  
against this property and cannot be sold to anyone with any percentage  
of Negroid blood for a period of 99 years, and is sold subject to resi-  
dential purposes only.

This conveyance is made subject to the right-of-way of Duke  
Power Company."
