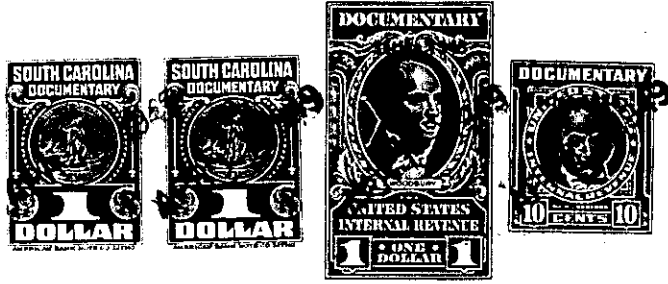

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in O'neal Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, about one half mile west from Milford Baptist Church lying on the west side of the Groce Meadow Road, being bounded on the north by another tract being conveyed this day by me to B. C. Campbell, on the east by the said Meadow Road and lands of Hudson, on the south by land of Homer Harbin and on the west by lot of B. J. and A. J. Arledge, and being a part of the same tract conveyed to me by deed from Mrs. Ella P. Groce, and having the following courses and distances, to wit :-

Beginning on a point in the said Groce Meadow Road, joint corner of the Homer Harbin land and on the Hudson line, and runs thence with the said road N. 9-30 W. 475 feet to a point in the said road and on the Hudson line; thence a new line (the dividing line of this tract and of the tract being conveyed to B. C. Campbell) S. 80-45 W. 525 feet to a stake on the Arledge line; thence with the arledge line S. 14-45 E. 302.5 feet to an iron pin on the arledge line and joint corner of the Homer Harbin tract; thence with the Harbin line S. 80-15 E. 495 feet to the beginning corner and containing Five and Five One-hundredths (5.05) acres, more or less.
