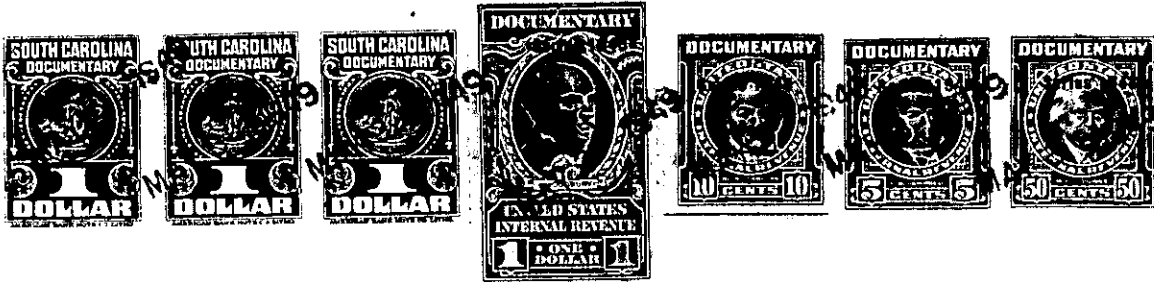

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. P. Holifield,
a one-half undivided interest in and to

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, just outside of the City of Greenville on the
south side of Laurens Road, and having according to survey and plat
prepared by Pickell and Pickell, Engineers, August 4, 1945, the
following metes and bounds, courses and distances, to wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the south side of Laurens Road,
which pin is 64.7 feet from the southeast intersection of Haviland
Street and the said Laurens Road and on the joint corner of Lot con-
veyed by J. A. Moody to G. D. Roberson by deed recorded in Vol. 287,
Page 443, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County and running thence
S. 22-15 W. 87 feet to iron pin, joint corners of this lot with
the Roberson lot in the rear; thence N. 70-30 W. 24.2 feet to iron
pin, the joint corners of this lot and the Vaughan lot; thence
N. 21 E. 87.3 feet to iron pin on the south side of Laurens Road;
thence with Laurens Road S. 72-45 E. 26.2 feet to the point and
place of the beginning, same being marked by an iron pin.
