


County, State of South Carolina, located on the North-East side of the Andersons Bridge Road, East of Simpsonville, S. C., adjoining lands of Perry Howard and others, and having according to a plat and Survey made by E. E. Gary, Surveyor, on April 23, 1949, the following metes and bounds:-

BEGINNING at an iron pin in the Andersons Bridge Road, joint corner with Perry Howard, and running thence along Andersons Bridge Road N. 26 3/4 E. 1.09 chains to point in road; thence still along road N. 20 1/4 E. 7.87 chains to an iron pin; thence S 65 3/4 E. 13.22 chains to an iron pin; thence S. 13 3/4 E. 7.91 chains to an iron pin, joint corner with Perry Howard; thence by a new dividing line N. 75 W. 14.29 chains to an iron pin; thence N. 73 1/4 W. 3.54 chains to the beginning corner, and containing 11.90 acres more or less.
