OUTLINE OF PROTECTIVE COVERNMES APPLICABLE TO PROPERTY COSSION OF WOODF FELDS, INC., KNOWN AS WOODFIELDS 3 11 Pil 1944

- L. These covenants are to run with the land and shall be binding on all parties and all persons claiming under them until January I, 1971, at which time said covenants shall be automatically extended for successive periods of 10 years unless by vote of a majority of the then owners of the lots it is agreed to change said covenants in whole or in part.
- 2. These covenants as hereinafter set forth are applicable to lots numbered 200 through 214 and lots numbered 216 through 240, which lots have been surveyed and designated by lot number on plat of property of Woodfields, Inc., recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book W, Page 75, but are not applicable to the property of Woodfields as shown on said recorded plat that has not been designated by lot number.
- 3. If the parties hereto, or any of them, or their heirs or assigns, shall violate or attempt to violate any of the covenants herein it shall be lawful for any other person or persons owning any real property situated in said development or subdivision to prosecute any proceedings at law or in equity against the person or persons violating or attempting to violate any such covenant and either to prevent him or them from so doing or to recover damages or other dues for such violation.
- 4. Invalidation of any one of these covenants by judgment or court order shall in no wise affect any of the other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.
- 5. All the above numbered lots in the tract shall be known and described as residential lots. No structure shall be erected, altered, placed, or permitted to remain on any residential building plot other than onedetached single-family dwelling not to exceed two and one-half stories in height and a private garage for not more than two cars.
- 6. No live stock, cattle, swine, sheep, goats, or other such animals of similar breed shall be permitted to be kept on any residential plot. Likewise, no chickens, ducks, geese, or other such fowls shall be permitted or kept on any residential plot except that fowls may be maintained in a limited number not in excess of ten, for the purpose of being consumed by the family residing on such residential plot.
- 7. No building shall be erected, placed or altered on any building plot in this subdivision until the building plans, specifications, and plot plan showing the location of such building have been approved in writing as to conformity and harmony of external design with existing structures in the subdivision, and as to location of the building with respect to topography and finished ground elevation by a committee composed of R. M. Caine, B. R. O'Neall and Fletcher C. Mann, or by a representative designated by a majority of the members of said committee. In the event of death or resignation of any member of said committee, the remaining member, or members, shall have full authority to approve or disapprove such design and location, or to designate a
