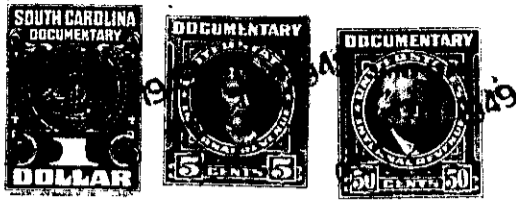

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, T. L. Greene, of Greenville County, in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Conway Grady Holcombe and Eulalia S. Holcombe, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Conway Grady Holcombe and Eulalia S. Holcombe, their heirs and assigns:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Butler Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the North side of the Old Spartanburg Road, about five miles east of the Greenville County Court House and being known and designated as Lot No. 2 of the Property of T. L. Greene, and described by courses and distances as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the Old Spartanburg Road 500 feet Southwest from the corner of the lot sold by me to Fred H. Outerbridge and running thence along the center of said Spartanburg Road, S. 76-20 W. 150 feet to a point in the center of said road; thence N. 11-30 W. 290 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 76-30 E. 150 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 11-30 E. 290 feet to the beginning point and containing one acre.

The above described property is a part of the same land conveyed to T. L. Greene by deed of Mrs. J. K. Hair, said deed being recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Deed Book Vol. 224 at page 361.
